- 675 contract professors in 2008/2009

- 34.9% tenured professors and researchers of international origin
- 12% of students of international origin (average for state universities is 2.6%)

- 73.5% graduate within the prescribed course duration (national average is 37.9%)
- 3.8 years is the average time needed to graduate (national average is 5.3 years)
- 49.3% of students "definitely" satisfied with their courses
- 77.3% of graduates undertake an internship (national average is 50.8%)
- 81.5% of graduates are in employment within one year after graduation (national average is 51.3%)
- 19.7% of graduates have spent some time on exchanges abroad during their studies (national average is 11.7%)
