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Deadline to receive nominations of	10 June, for the fall/winter (1st) semester or the whole academic year 10 November, for the spring/summer (2nd) semester
selected students (e-mail sent by the home university)	Students applying for the Master in Eco-Social Design must submit their portfolio <u>as an additional admission requirement</u> . Students will only be admitted after a positive evaluation of the portfolio. Furthermore, their nominations must be submitted by May 10 for the first semester and by October 10 for the second semester. All portfolios will be assessed by the course council towards the end of May / the end of October. The results regarding acceptance will be communicated to the students by early June / early November.

Credit system	ECTS – European Credit transfer system: credit points are indicated in the course list for each course 1 ECTS credit point is equal to 6 hours of teaching and a workload of 25 hours for an average student



Full time workload/semester	30 ECTS/ semester depending on the degree programme and study year
Exams/Grading system	Exams are graded on a scale from 1 to 30, with 18 being the minimum grade for passing and 30 as the maximum grade. A "cum laude" (c.l.) can be added to the maximum grade as a special distinction.
Language of instruction	Faculty of Engineering and Agriculture Bachelor's degree: 90 % English, 10% German and Italian Master's degree: almost exclusively in English All the other faculties: One third of the courses of each degree programme is taught in English, one third in Italian and one third in German (see course description for details, the teaching language of each course can be different in the academic year 2023/24)

Accommodation:

Accommodation assistance	The Free University of Bozen-Bolzano tries to accommodate exchange students in student halls of residence (administered by the local government).
	Non-EU bilateral agreement exchange students will be granted accommodation as they need to have one before their arrival in order to obtain the student Visa to enter Italy. Please notice that Turkey is an Erasmus+ Partner and therefore Turkish citizens will need to apply like other EU students.
	EU and Turkish citizens can apply for accommodation in our student house. Requests will be evaluated via a Google form on a "first come first served" basis. Terms and deadlines will be communicated in due time.



	Since places are limited, it is recommended to look for private accommodation. Students can check offers on the university's online notice board http://accommodationunibz.blogspot.it/ or online through www.yost.apartments or send us an advert, which will be published on the notice board.
Prices	Single room at student hall of residence: € 295 including expenses/month (+ returnable deposit: € 590). A full semester contract will be signed with the residence administration. The contracts are for 5 or 10 months according the stay. Private accommodation ranges from € 350 to € 500/month for a single room in a shared apartment (+ returnable deposit: 2-3 month rents)
Move into residence	Fall/winter (1st) semester: from 22 September 2024 to 22 February 2025 (to be confirmed by the residence) Spring/summer (2nd) semester: from 01 March 2025 to 01 August 2025 (to be confirmed by the residence)

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Average costs of living and studying	 Entry Visa: The Italian Student Visa is free of charge and has to be requested at an Italian Consulate/Embassy (students have to be prepared to long processing times) Italian residence permit (to be requested once at place within 8 working days from the entrance in the Schengen Area): costs related to the issue ~ € 130 Food and personal items: ~ € 300/ Public transport (bus, train): several possibilities according to individual needs ~ € 150 Textbooks: can be lent at our library, teaching materials will be offered in digital format
