The pupils and teachers at Flaas primary school were actively involved in the project from the outset, which took the form of a workshop led by Professors Kuno Prey with Mariagiovanna Di Iorio and Alberta Schiefer. They were given an insight into all phases of the project work and became part of the creative and technical realisation of an installation in public space, from planning to realisation and installation in the immediate vicinity of the school. The result is a self-explanatory installation consisting of 11 stainless steel viewing tubes that point specifically to the surrounding mountains of the Dolomites. In future, pupils, locals and tourists will be able to admire the individual mountains and read their names and heights on the individual tubes. The project was realised by the Italian vocational school Luigi Einaudi in collaboration with craftsmen from Flaas am Tschögglberg.







The title of the project was chosen due to the special location of Flaas primary school and includes the aspect of closer observation and knowledge of the home, the mountains and the environment in which the pupils spend their everyday lives.
